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Centralized Admission Process for Admission to the Integrated PG programmes in affiliated colleges for the academic year 2026-27

1. Introduction

Prospectus for Admission to integrated PG programmes to the colleges affiliated to the University of Calicut is published herewith. It contains general information and rules relating to the admission to integrated PG programmes 2026-27, and other connected matters. Candidates are required to go through the Prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with all the relevant information relating to the admission. Candidates are also requested to visit the website of the Directorate of Admissions ‘<https://admission.uoc.ac.in/>’ regularly for latest notifications and announcements. This prospectus is applicable only for admission to integrated PG programmes in affiliated colleges for the academic year 2026-27.

1.1 Course Duration and Exit option:

Admission taken at the first semester shall be admission to “Five Year Integrated PG programme” and students will not be required to take re-admission at any stage of the programme unless the student discontinues the programme after VIth semester. The programme framework provides additional entry point as, the student, who has discontinued his/her studies on obtaining corresponding degree from integrated programme, can join at a later date for the programme to complete Masters Degree, if vacancy available and is subject to the decision of the University. If any vacancy arises due to discontinuation or exit option after VI Semester, fresh admission shall be allowed subject to University Admission regulations.

The Integrated PG Programme is a five-year (10 semesters) programme with an exit option after the completion of VI Semester. Students who have successfully completed according to the minimum mark/grade required for pass and apply for exit option will be awarded Degree in areas concerned. The degree awarded as per the exit options is as equivalent as the degrees of any non-integrated programme. Students, who continue the programme and successfully complete X semester will be awarded Integrated Masters Degree in the area concerned.

1.2 A candidate having an integrated PG Degree/UG Degree can avail another integrated PG programme under regular mode provided the other eligibility criteria of the respective programmes are satisfied. A candidate can pursue two academic programmes (either in UG/integrated PG / PG) simultaneously one in regular mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode, without overlapping the class timing of the other programme. Candidates taking additional Integrated PG shall not be eligible for any fee concession and reservation for admission.

2. For special attention

2.1. Application should be submitted online through the website of the Directorate of Admissions <https://admission.uoc.ac.in/> and carefully follow the instructions for registration before applying online.

2.2. Students should keep a printout of the application submitted online and present it to the college at the time of admission. Copy of the online application need not be sent to the University.

2.3. The application should be submitted very carefully. In case of loss / denial of admission due to inaccuracies in the application, the entire responsibility lies with the respective applicant.

2.4. Applicants claiming reservation, weightage marks etc. should produce the certificates as per the Govt / University Admissions rules at college at the time of admission.

2.5. Eligibility for integrated programmes, indexing method and colleges where courses are available are published in the website.

2.6. Candidates should submit only one online application for admission to any or all of the courses subject to eligibility.

Important information related to admission will be published in the website in due course. Students seeking admission should carefully follow these instructions. University shall not give individual information about admission process.

3. Equivalency / Recognition

Equivalency / Recognition of the qualifying examinations taken from other Universities/Institutions/NIOS (candidates who have passed the course with a minimum of five subjects, out of which one should be English) should be confirmed strictly before making admission of students, except in the case of HSE / VHSE of the Kerala State Board and all regular Higher Secondary Examinations conducted by other State Boards, AISSCE (XII std.) of CBSE and ISCE.

The admitting authorities have to verify properly and ensure the genuineness of the claims of the candidates regarding the qualifications, mode of study of the course, equivalency/recognition certificates etc. before granting admission.

4. Online registration:

The students can submit online application to various colleges and programmes. The candidates can register online directly from home, Akshaya Centres, firms providing INTERNET facilities etc through website <https://admission.uoc.ac.in/>.

All candidates irrespective of the Quota/Category of admission, seeking admission to the programmes falling under the purview of CAP should compulsorily complete online registration of the application through Centralised Admission Process (CAP). Candidates without the print out of the application form are not eligible for admission.

Application for late registration, which is after the last date of online registration shall not be generally entertained without prior permission from the University. Such applications shall be considered only after exhausting the applications received in time.

5. Number of options:

Candidates can opt maximum programmes of their choice, subject to their eligibility, on priority basis from the affiliated colleges through simple online steps (website <https://admission.uoc.ac.in/>). Candidates who desire to take admission under community quota seats available at aided colleges shall specify the same at the time of online registration. Community quota seat eligible for candidates among their options will be considered for community quota admission.

6. Indexing:

6.1 The merit of the candidate shall be assessed for ranking on the basis of marks obtained by him / her in the qualifying examination together with the weightages, if any, for admission to the particular programme, subject to such indexing criteria as may be prescribed by the University. The index marks are being calculated by software, based on the details of marks and bonus/weightage category opted by the candidates. The University will verify the marks only if any anomalies in the mark entered by the candidate is reported. Therefore, all the Principals/Head of the Institutions are instructed to verify the index marks of the candidates before admitting the candidate.

6.2 SEBC/OEC candidates are eligible for relaxation in qualifying examination marks/grades up to 5%. SC/ST/PwD(U.O.No. 3233/2024/Admn Dated:24.02.2024) candidates need only to get a pass

mark/grade.

7. Bonus/Weightage marks:

The following weightage will be considered for calculating the index mark.

The benefit of bonus marks for the purpose of admission can be availed of by the candidates only under any one category, either N.S.S or N.C.C or SPC or Scout,Guide, Ranger, Rover.

The applicant need to produce the relevant certificate in original for the claiming bonus mark at the time of admission.

8. Seat Categorization

The seats available in the various colleges are categorized as,

1. Open merit Seats
2. Mandatory reservation Seats
3. Community Quota Seats
4. Management Quota Seats
5. Other Reservation Category Seats
6. Special Reservation Category seats.

8.1 Open merit Seats:

The open merit seats filled by the University in Government/ Aided colleges shall be purely on the basis of the Index mark. The merit of the candidate shall be assessed for ranking on the basis of marks obtained by him / her in the qualifying examination for admission to the particular programme, subject to such criteria as may be prescribed by the University. For admission to Integrated PG programmes, the marks obtained in the Plus Two examination conducted by the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination is taken as the standard.

8.2 Mandatory Reservation seat categories:

Only candidates having nativity certificate issued by a competent authority in Kerala are eligible for claiming seats under Mandatory Reservation.

8.3 SEBC (Socially and Educationally Backward Communities).

- (a) Ezhava/Thiyya/Billava (ETB)
- (b) Muslim (MUSLIM)
- (c) Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indian (LC)
- (d) Other Backward Christians (OBX)
- (e) Other Backward Hindus (OBH)

The seats for SEBC will be filled by the University in Government colleges from among the registered students belonging to the above category are purely on the basis of the index mark. A community certificate along with Non creamy layer certificate from the Kerala revenue authorities concerned has to be produced by the SEBC candidates who claim reservation under SEBC category at the time of admission. The validity of Non creamy layer certificate should be as stipulated in the Government orders prevailing at the time of admission.

8.4 Scheduled Caste (SC):The seats for SC will be filled by the University in Government/Aided colleges from among the registered students belonging to scheduled caste shall be purely on the basis of index mark. A community certificate from the Kerala state revenue authorities concerned has to be produced by the SC candidates who claim reservation under SC category at the time of admission. (The list of SC communities is appended as **APPENDIX II**)

8.5 Scheduled Tribe (ST):The seats for ST will be filled by the University in Government/Aided colleges from among the registered students belonging to scheduled tribe shall be purely on the basis merit. A community certificate from the Kerala state revenue authorities concerned has to be produced by the ST candidates who claim reservation under ST category at the time of admission.(The list of ST communities is appended as **APPENDIX III**).

9. Claims for mandatory reservations:

Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by the candidate in the relevant column of the online application in CAP. However, the supporting documents shall be submitted only at the time of admission in the colleges concerned. The claims for mandatory reservation once made in the Application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstance.

9.1. Claim for Communal reservation under ‘Socially and Educationally Backward Classes(SEBC)

Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O.(P)208/66/Edn. Dated 02.05.1966, GO(P).2/2017/BCDD dated 08.03.2017, as amended from time to time. Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other backward Hindus, Latin Catholic other than Anglo Indians and Other backward Christian communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably produce both ‘Community’ and ‘Non Creamy Layer Certificates (GO(P) 2/2017BCDD dated 08.03.2017)’ obtained from the Village Officer concerned in Kerala. Attested copies of the above certificates should be submitted at the time of admission. The seats un-availed by SEBC category candidates will be allotted under open merit quota.(The list of SEBC communities is appended as **APPENDIX I**)

9.2. Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota:

Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota should obtain caste/community certificate from the Tahasildar. The seats un-availed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa.

9.3. Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates:

Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the unavailed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates obtained from the Village Officer concerned. Those OEC candidates whose annual family income is up to the amount stipulated by the Government for this purpose from time to time alone are eligible for such seats. Candidates belonging to other eligible communities are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to Integrated PG

Programmes under Government/Community quota irrespective of annual family income as per G.O (MS)No.36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007. They should produce Community Certificate from the Village Officer at the time of admission in the college concerned.(The list of OEC communities is appended as **APPENDIX IV**)

10. Community Quota (Aided Colleges only).

The seats for community quota in Aided colleges are filled upon merit basis from among the students of the community of the particular management running the college. 20 percentage of the total seats in the Aided colleges run by backward community managements and 10 percentage of the total seats in the Aided colleges run by forward community managements are reserved for community quota. The University will forward the list of the applied students to the colleges on the date published in the schedule for admission. The list of applied students will also be published in the college login. The colleges will also publish the community rank list in the notice board. The colleges will admit the candidates, based on their merit from this rank list as per the schedule published by the University.

11. Management Quota (Aided Colleges).

The seats for management quota in Aided colleges are filled by the Colleges. Candidates seeking admission to the Management Quota in Aided colleges should register in CAP. In addition to this candidates should contact the colleges he/she intends to take admissions and submit separate applications in the colleges concerned. The eligibility of the students should be verified by the colleges before issuing forms to the students requesting for admission before conducting online registration.

12. Other Reservation Category Seats:

12.1. Economically Weaker Sections. (EWS)

The seats for EWS will be filled by the University in all affiliated colleges (In all institutions which do not have minority status and permit reservation to other backward classes) from the registered students belonging to Economically Weaker Sections who are not covered under existing scheme of reservation for the scheduled caste, the scheduled tribe and the Socially and educationally backward classes. (U.O.No. 10306/2022/Admn Dated 21.05.2022). Anthyodaya Annayojana (AAY)/Priority House Hold (PHH) certificate/Income and Asset certificate with Applicaan's family income 4 lakhs or below issued from Village Officer/ Tahasildar should be produced by the candidates who wish to avail of reservation under EWS category at the time of admission. Documents like ration card will not be accepted for availing reservation to this category. Applicants' whose names are entered in the Ration Cards issued

to the families in the category of AAY or PHH should submit the certificate in the prescribed format issued by Village officer.(The format of certificate is given as **APPENDIX VI**). Applicants except AAY) or PHH should submit the certificate in the prescribed format issued by Village officer.(The format of certificate is given as **APPENDIX VII**)

12.2. Persons with Disabilities (PwD):

Five percentage (5%) of the seats are reserved for Persons with Disabilities. Blind, Deaf and Hard of Hearing students are not eligible for admission to Integrated PG programmes in Science subjects involving practicals. The candidates who claim seats under PwD should produce the medical certificate issued by the district medical board or competent authorities stating that the disability is 40% or above. The category of the disabilities should be specified clearly in the medical certificate. The University will forward the rank list of the applied students under PwD to the colleges on the date published in the schedule for admission. The rank list of applied students under PwD will also be published in the college login. The colleges will also publish the PwD rank list in the notice board. The colleges will admit the candidates, based on their merit from this rank list as per the schedule published by the University. (The list of PwD categories is appended as **APPENDIX VIII**)

12.3. Sports Quota

One seat within the sanctioned intake for each Integrated PG Programme should be reserved for Sports Quota.

12.3.1 The norms for eligibility for admission to the Sports Quota in Integrated PG Programmes.

1. Representing the country in International competitions
2. Winning the I/II/III in the Senior National Championships
3. Representing Senior State National Championships

4. Representing the Senior district and participating in the State Championships
5. Winning I/II/III place in the State Junior/Youth Championships
6. Representing the Polytechnic /VHSE/ITI/HSE Representing Senior State in South Zone Championships.
7. Winning the I/II/III in the Junior Youth National Championships
8. Winning I/II/III in All India School Games.
9. Representing the State in the Junior/Youth National Championships
10. Representing the State in the Junior/Youth South Zone Championships.
11. Representing the ISCE/CBSE/Central School/Navodaya Vidyalaya and winning First/ Second/ Third in the National Championships.
12. Winning I/II/III place in the Senior Inter District Championships.
13. Winning I/II/III in the State Championship
14. Representing Educational district and winning First/Second/Third place in the Championship.
15. Representing CBSE/ISCE/Central School/Navodaya Vidyalaya and winning First/ Second/ Third place in Zonal/Cluster tournaments.
16. Representing State in the ISCE/CBSE/Navodaya Vidyalaya and participating in the National Championships.
17. Representing State in the Rural National/Women Festival.
18. Representing Educational District and participating in the State Championships.

19. Winning I/II/III in All India Inter University/Khelo India University games,

20. Representing University in All India Inter University .

21. Winning I/II/III in University Inter Collegiate Championship .

13. Special Reservation Category seats.

13.1. Lakshadweep Quota :

One seat each for the Integrated PG Programme in the affiliated Arts and Science Colleges is additionally created and reserved over and above the sanctioned strength for the native students of the Union Territory of Lakshadweep, recommended by the Director of Education, Union Territory of Lakshadweep. These candidates need not be insisted to obtain permission from the University for late registration up to the closing of admission to the respective programmes of study (Lr.Dtd.24.09.1997). If there is no claimant from among the Ethnic Native Scheduled Tribe Candidates from the Union Territory for the seat reserved for them for Integrated PG programmes, the seats thus falling vacant due to their absence, will be allotted to the children of the employees belonging to Kerala State who have undergone Plus Two education in the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. (GA/A2/6135/94 dated 16.3.1998) The admission shall be made only after obtaining prior permission from the University. (GA I/A2/6135/ 1994 (1) dated 29-08-2000 & GAI/A2/3897/2003 dated 05.06.2003). The candidates recommended by the Director of Education Union Territory of Lakshadweep shall be admitted by the colleges.

13.2. Andaman Nicobar Islands:

Additional seats can be created over and above the sanctioned strength for the native students of Andaman & Nicobar islands, as recommended by the Directorate of Education, Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

14. Seat Classification in various category of colleges:

14.2. Mandatory reservation in Aided Affiliated colleges.

The seats for each programme will be distributed as per the existing pattern given below.

The seats under community quota shall be reserved for students of the community to which the college belongs and such seats shall be filled on the basis of merit. The seats under management quota shall be filled by the management from among the candidates of their choice subject to the eligibility.

15. PROGRAMMES OFFERED:**15.1. Integrated M.Sc Botany with Computational Biology.****15.1.1. Eligibility:**

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognised as equivalent there to with Biology as a compulsory paper are eligible for admission.

15.1.2. Indexing:

Total marks obtained for Part III + the marks obtained for Biology or Botany.

15.2. Integrated M.Sc. Statistics**15.2.1 Eligibility:**

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent there to, with Mathematics group in Science Stream or Candidates who have studied Mathematics/Statistics with other combinations at HSE level are eligible for admission to the Integrated M.Sc. Statistics Programme

15.2.2. Indexing:

Total marks obtained for Part III + the marks obtained for the Mathematics.

15.3. Integrated M.Sc. Psychology.

15.3.1. Eligibility:

A pass in higher secondary or equivalent as approved by the Government of Kerala or Central Government of India with 50% of marks in aggregate.

15.3.2. Indexing:

The total marks and its percent will be considered for indexing the candidates where as those who had studied Psychology as an optional subject for higher secondary, in any stream will get an additional weightage of adding 50% of their marks in Psychology subject, altogether.

15.4. Integrated M.A. Politics & International Relations.

15.4.1 Eligibility:

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission.

15.4.2. Indexing:

Plus two marks will be the basic criteria for science students. Those who studied Humanities will be given 40 marks, additional to the Plus two Marks. Those who studied Humanities subjects with Political Science as a paper will be given 10 more marks as additional weightage. (Plus two marks + 40 marks + 10 Marks)

15.5. Integrated M.A. Malayalam.

15.5.1. Eligibility:

Candidates who have passed (Eligible for Higher Studies) the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission.

15.5.2. Indexing:

Total Marks+Twice the marks secured in Additional Language/Second language concerned (Malayalam). A weightage of 20 marks will be given to those who have studied the Malayalam as optional subject for HSE or an equivalent examination with second language.

15.6. Integrated M.A. English and Media Studies.

15.6.1. Eligibility:

Candidate who has passed the HSE of the Kerala State Board of Higher Secondary Examination or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission.

15.6.2. Indexing:

Score secured for English is added twice to total score to calculate the index mark. (Total Marks+2(Marks for English))

15.6.3.Weightage:

Weightage of 20 marks will be given to the candidates who have studied English or Communicative English as optional subject for HSE or an equivalent examination. An additional weightage of 10 marks will be given to the candidates who have studied journalism or media studies as optional subject for HSE or an equivalent examination.

16. Instructions for Applying through CAP

Visit the website <http://admission.uoc.ac.in/>. The admission through Centralized Admission process to Integrated programmes will be conducted in two Continuous phases.

Phase 1: Submission of Application

Phase 2: Fee Payment.

16.1.Keep ready the following for the submission of application for Integrated Programmes and read the instructions.

Date of Birth: copy of S.S.L.C

Mobile Number: mobile number of student/parents/guardian only to be furnished. Vital information regarding admissions are being communicated through SMS to the registered mobile number. Therefore, under any circumstances the mobile number of Akshaya centres, internet cafe or other agencies should not be submitted.

E-mail: Email Id of student/parents/guardian only be entered. Those who do not have an Email-Id may create one and enter. Vital information regarding the allotment and admissions will also be communicated through Email to the registered mail.

Fee : As per admission notification for each Course/Programme.

Copy of the Qualifying Examination Mark Sheet.

Scanned copy of Passport size photograph in '.jpg' format .

Prepare the list of colleges/courses according to the applicants priority. List of colleges and programmes/courses are available in the website(<https://admission.uoc.ac.in/>).

IMPORTANT: Please ensure that all information in the application are correct before submitting it. Click Preview button to view the details entered. The candidates can edit the data entered including photo till the FINAL SUBMISSION is done. After FINAL SUBMISSION the data can be edited by using the Edit Button on or before the last date for online registration prior to allotments.

16.2. Phase 1: Submission of Application

The application can be submitted as follows.

16.2.1. Part1:

CAP ID Generation

16.2.2 Click “**REGISTER**” button.

16.2.3 Enter mobile number and click "REGISTER"

16.2.4 Enter the OTP received in the registered mobile number.

16.2.5 CAP ID and password will be received in the registered mobile number/email id through SMS/ mail. • login with the details above.

16.3. Part 2: Student Profile

16.3.1. Enter the details in the blank fields .

16.3.2. Enter number of chances taken to pass the qualifying examinations. 10 marks will be reduced for each additional chances taken to pass the qualifying examination subject to a maximum of 25 marks

16.3.3. The number of chances means the number of chances taken for passing any part or parts of the qualifying examination. Betterment/Improvement examination will not be considered as a chance. The number of chances printed in the qualification certificate should be entered here.

16.3.4. The candidates who have qualified the HSE and VHSE of the Government of Kerala under ‘ SAY’ scheme and Compartmental Examination of CBSE are also eligible for admission to Integrated PG programmes/courses in the same academic year.

16.3.5. Specify the Board/University of the qualifying examinations.

16.3.6. Enter the stream of study of the Qualifying examinations, if necessary (Science, Humanities, Commerce).

16.3.7. Utmost care should be taken while entering reservation details. Opt only the eligible reservations otherwise admission will be denied. Valid certificate must be produced at the time of admission

16.3.8. Upload & Resize your photograph in jpeg format.

- 1.The photo must be taken within the last six months on a white background.
- 2.The photo must have at least 80% face visibility (without wearing a mask), and must be printed with the name and date taken.

The details entered can be edited before final submission. To move to the next part CLICK “SAVE & PROCEED” button.

16.4. Part 3: Qualification Details

Utmost care should be taken while entering the marks.

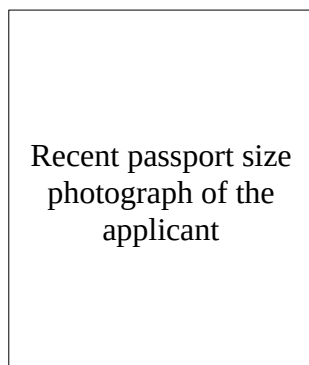

APPENDIX VIII

Types of Disabilities, PwD Act 2016 (List and Definition)

I. Physical disability.

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculo skeletal or nervous system or both), including—

(a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

(i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;

(ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;

(iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;

(b) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

(c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;

(d) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

(e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

(a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

(i) total absence of sight; or

(ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or

(iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely: visual

acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

- (i) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment.

- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

- (b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

D. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

- (b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro- developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour,—"mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by sub normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

- (a) chronic neurological conditions, such as— (i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

- (ii) "parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neuro transmitter dopamine.

Blood disorder— (i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

(ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
